Timing of PNC	Make first postnatal contact with health care provider within 24 hours, second contact within 2 to 3 days, third contact within 2 weeks, and fourth contact within 6 weeks after delivery	For completed postnatal care
Frequency of PNC	At least 4 antenatal visits must be taken during the postnatal period	For completed postnatal care
Health services	Take vitamin A capsule	For postnatal care
Early detection of high-risk conditions	Be aware of danger signs	For antenatal, intranatal and postnatal care
